Fine wines and candlelight make the Corsellis Room a distinctive place for an evening dinner.

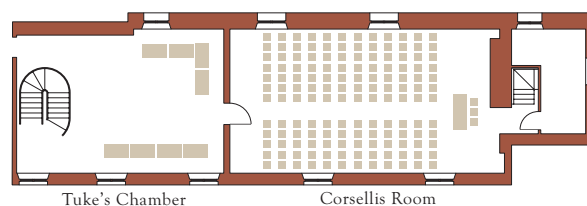
Below

The two larger conference rooms are known as Tuke's Chamber and the Corsellis Room.

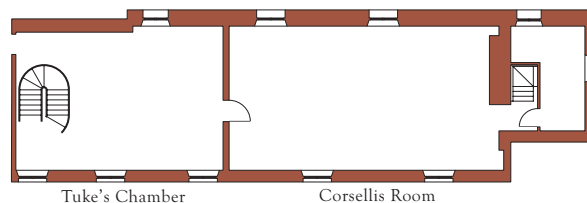
Tuke's Chamber and the Corsellis Room are situated on the first floor, above what used to be the dairy, larder and bakery. Both have fine pincer beam roofs, original wattle and daub walls and polished oak flooring.

Both rooms may be completely blacked out, and the Mulberry wall hangings of the Corsellis Room conceal behind them a large projector screen. The rooms benefit from excellent acoustics, so a sound system is not usually required.

Typical format for an in house conference of 120 people

11.30am	Presentations continue.
1.00pm	Lunch in Long Gallery, with delegates able to stretch their legs within the gardens, farm and grounds.
2.00pm	Delegates split into seminar groups, using the five meeting rooms of East Court, as well as Tuke's Chamber.
4.00pm	Plenary session in the Corsellis room.
4.20pm	Tea and biscuits in Tuke's Chamber, followed by departure.
